Message from the Lord Chief Justice: Courts Recovery

NEW 17 March 2021

Following the Prime Minister's announcement of the Government's roadmap to ease restrictions in England and the announcement by the First Minister of the Welsh Government's approach to coming out of lockdown, the courts must adapt to these changes. Remote and hybrid hearings will still play their part, with social distancing, hand sanitising, the wearing of face coverings and any local arrangements. This will ensure that as restrictions are eased, the administration of justice continues to be delivered safely. <u>Full statement here</u>

Covid testing pilot for court users

HMCTS has launched a pilot to trial the use of home testing kits among court users. The home testing kits are available to collect on-site from Birmingham Crown Court, Croydon Combined Court, Liverpool Combined Court QEII, Snaresbrook Crown Court and Wolverhampton Combined Court. The kits will be offered to all professional court users, legal professionals, judiciary, contractors, jurors, witness services and staff who attend scheduled hearings at the pilot sites. This pilot will last until 23 April 2021. Details here.

Huber (1) Lieskovska (2) v X-Yachts (GB) Ltd (1), X-Yachts A/S (2) [2020] EWHC 3082 (TCC) In this recent decision the court permitted parties in Denmark and Spain who were unable to travel to the UK due to COVID-19 travel restrictions, to appear by video from outside of England and Wales while giving evidence and attend and observe the entirety of the remote hearing from outside of England and Wales.
