“Reasonable Practicability and more – Life after Baker v Quantum”

APIL fellow Cenric Clement-Evans is a solicitor at New Law Cardiff.



In January 2012 Cenric moved to New Law Cardiff after over 11 years at Hugh James in Merthyr Tydfil and then Cardiff. At New Law he will be working with the expanding Employer’s Liability teams. His work has increasingly involved asbestos related injuries in addition to his expertise in dealing with Accidents at Work.

In April 2011, Cenric was re-elected to the APIL executive committee. He has previously served as co-ordinator and secretary of APIL’s special interest group on occupational health and co-ordinator of APIL Wales between 1998 and 2008.

Cenric has represented APIL on the Law Society working party reviewing the disease and ill-health pre-action protocol. He was one of the members of APIL’s occupational health SIG working party which created the very first draft of the protocol.

Cenric is a regular APIL lecturer and has lectured with Nigel Tomkins for many years in APIL’s accidents at work series. He has spoken at and chaired many APIL industrial disease conferences including most recently APIL’s 2011 Asbestos Conference.

Previously he developed a special interest in noise induced hearing loss claims (NIHL) and is the co-author of the chapter on NIHL in the occupational illness litigation.

Cenric is delighted at the acknowledgement in the 14th and 15th editions of the “EL bible” “Munkman on Employer’s Liability” (Cotter and Bennett). He has also been named as a leader in his field in the Chambers guide to the UK legal profession.

Cenric is a Welsh speaker born in Liverpool in 1962. He is a graduate of the University College of Wales, Aberystwyth. He lives in Cardiff and is married to Louise with two sons, Tomos Cian and Osian Hedd. His interests include being a taxi service for his sons and football.
