Gordon is the author of written Personal Injury Practice Notes (Cavendish); The APIL Guide to Fatal Accidents; the 11th edition of Munkman on Damages for Personal Injury Death, and Periodical Payments the New Law. He also writes the section on limitation for the APIL loose-leaf.

Gordon has appeared in several of the leading cases relating to procedure, service of the claim form and the assessment of damages.

Gordon writes the "Civil Litigation Brief", one of the most widely read sites on litigation, evidence and procedure.
